Through her work, she aspires to provide insight and clarity into our contemporary visual culture and communication trends, offering viewers a window into the complexities of the human experience






What themes does this work explore, beyond mere reflection?


How does the work prompt viewers to explore freedom?

How does the work balance movement and stillness?



How do these paintings balance contentment amid


change?
